She explains the motives behind acid attacks that range from something as simple as a girl rejecting a boy's gestures of affection, to more deep-seated cultural issues such as dowry. While vengeance is a key reason behind this heinous crime. She also gave a detailed list legal repercussions in the form of stringent punishments if one commits such crime. The program was attended by the faculty members of the college along with more than 100 students.

She also impressed upon the crime against women at their work places and talked about the provisions in the Constitution of India against such crimes especially the heinous crimes like 'sexual harassment' which affect the victims physically as well as mentally. She also states that since more and more women are becoming work oriented now, so this is the need of the hour to provide a conducive and safer place to the women at their work places.
